Evaluation Methods Used:

The evaluation of SigningHub 10 employed a comprehensive approach utilizing both manual and automated testing methods. This assessment was conducted to verify conformance with the **Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.1 Level AA**, and to ensure compliance with both the **Revised Section 508 Standards of the United States** and the **European Union EN 301 549 accessibility requirements**.

Based on this evaluation, SigningHub 10 meets the applicable accessibility requirements defined under both U.S. Section 508 and EU EN 301 549 standards.

Note:

SigningHub 10 demonstrates **partial conformance** to the WCAG 2.1 Level AA standards. Despite supporting most success criteria, certain areas indicate the need for further enhancement, particularly regarding **contrast, input identification**, and **error handling**. Although media-related criteria were deemed not applicable, the overall findings suggest ongoing efforts to refine these accessibility features will further strengthen SigningHub 10's compliance profile.

The results of this evaluation not only ensure the platform begins to meet necessary standards but lays a foundational commitment towards continuously improving its usability for all users, including those with disabilities. In striving for inclusivity, the SigningHub team aims to create a robust user experience that aligns with industry best practices.
